

## A Report on Swachhta Pakhwada

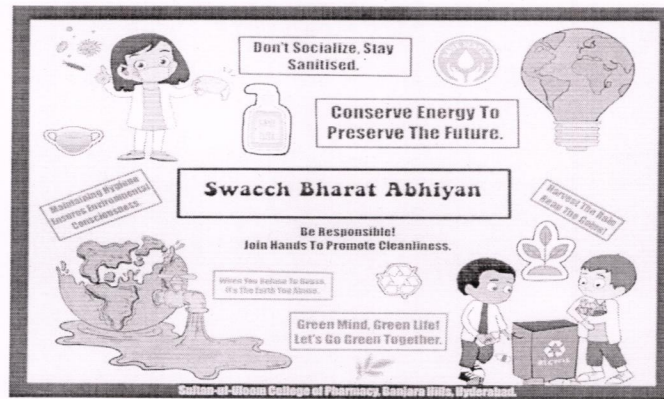

The **Sultan ul Uloom College of Pharmacy, Hyderabad** successfully conduct a poster presentation competition on “National Energy Conservation Day” along with students and staff to vocalize the importance of energy conservation. The objective is to drive mass awareness about the importance of energy efficiency and conservation. All the students have taken part actively and they have been motivated to come up with innovative ideas to save energy more efficiently. Through posters, students depicted various good habits to save electricity and talked about measures to be taken up to save energy more efficiently. The students conveyed a message for energy conservation through their ideas and creative minds. The great insights presented by students were regarding conservation of the renewable resources. The activity is mainly focused on reduced usage of electricity in houses as well as institutions. To knowledge the students about the hardness in generation, transmission and distribution of power by conducting this presentation activity. It inculcate the importance of energy conservation amongst students and society.



## Webinar on Innovative Technologies for Waste Recycling and Energy Conservation

The students and faculty of **Sultan ul Uloom College of Pharmacy** attended a webinar on the concept of "Innovative Technologies for Waste Recycling and Energy Conservation".

The webinar ran from 9:50 AM to 2 PM, it was attended by around 60 students and many dignitaries gave speeches regarding the importance of being creative and innovative in conserving the non-renewable sources of energy that we have.

In the Zoom meeting style webinar, the faculty first explained why energy conservation is important, and many ideas that are already in existence that have helped sustain these sources of energy so far. They emphasized on the practicality of such innovations.

Students also presented their opinions on the following topic:

**Use of technology in waste recycling system:** The following points were discussed which includes

### **1. Improved Recycling Rates**

Recycling and waste management companies are investing in improving their tools and techniques. The recent development in single-stream recycling where people can dump all the trash in one bin has reduced the sorting burden on people and drastically improved the rate of recycling. This has also reduced the truck count and ultimately the emissions as well.

### **2. Automated Waste Collection**

Technology has transformed the way waste management works with automated sensors that trigger instant alerts every time a container is full and needs service. Other innovative tools that are making the sorting process fast and easy include optical sorters, magnets and advanced disk screens. The trucks have also switched from diesel to natural gas for quieter and cost-effective operations. The use of logistics software, in-vehicle monitors, and mobile apps has further simplified the waste management process while ensuring driver safety.

### **3. Recycling plastic waste through chemical treatment**

Chemical recycling of plastics implies pyrolysis technology, which is entirely related to gasification. The transformation of plastic waste into liquid hydrocarbon can be beneficial to produce new products.

### **4. Turning waste into energy**

Turning waste into power is one of the most significant innovations in the waste management industry. Digesters are kind of machinery which can be used on a variety of waste where biogas can be converted into energy using heat and pressure.

### **5. Innovative ways to recycle valuable metals**

Technology like plasma arc recycling help recycle precious metals like platinum, palladium, and iridium which are used in chemical and auto industries.

Apart from this, ways to conserve energy were also discussed and the following points were emphasized:

### 1. Smarter and more connected homes

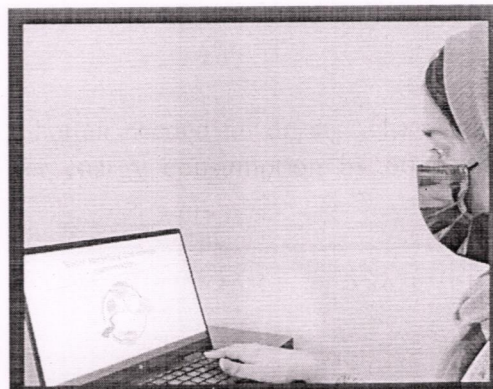
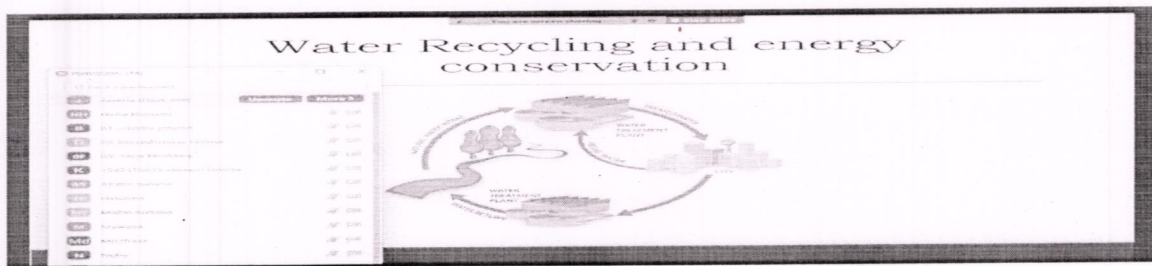
New electronic devices and appliances can now be linked to the Internet to provide real-time data that makes it easier to understand and lower energy use.

### 2. Ultra sufficient heat pumps

A fuel-fired, multi-function residential heat pump that can reduce primary energy consumption by 30 percent. A natural gas heat pump and air conditioner that uses an ultra-low-emission combustion burner and other equipment to provide home heating, cooling and hot water. A low-cost gas heat pump designed to reduce heating costs by 30 to 45 percent compared to conventional gas furnaces and boilers.

### 3. Carbon fighting clothes dryers

Cloth dryers that uses a heat pump cycle to generate hot air needed for drying. The result: a more efficient dryer that has the potential to lower energy consumption by 60 percent compared to conventional ones on the market today.





## Talk Show on the Best Practice in Swachhta Pakhwada – Personal, Physical, Environmental and Societal Day

Sultan ul Uloom College of Pharmacy had conducted a talk show on the topic "The Best practice in Swachhata-- Personal, Physical, Environmental and Societal Day" at 10:30AM via a Zoom meeting to create awareness on the a fore mentioned topic.

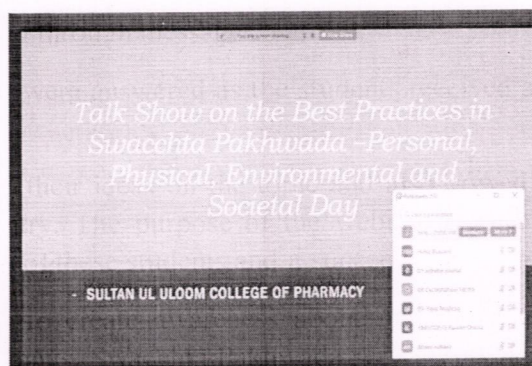
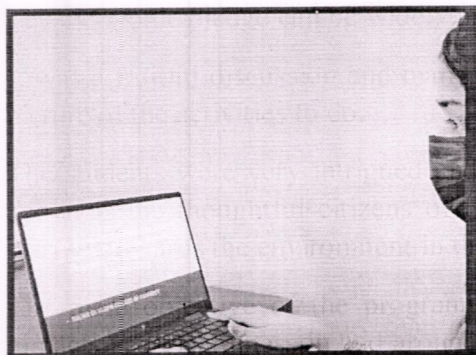
The electronic pledge can be widely publicized through messages.

The survey was a simple questionnaire with questions regarding the different methods of wastage of water that occur on a regular basis in most households. This made the students conscious about their own habits and thus they vowed to do better in the near future.



## Ban on Single Use Plastics – Special Talk

The event conducted was on the theme “Say No to Plastics” at 11 AM through offline mode in the seminar hall of our college, in the **Sultan ul Uloom College of Pharmacy** to create awareness on plastic pollution.

The meeting was attended by many dignitaries, professors and the students of the college, in this meeting the importance of reusing plastics and the reduction in the usage of plastics was emphasized. It is important to understand the harms of the accumulating plastics in the environment and hence the meeting did the job of making sure that the audience was well aware.

The talk began with discussion of the following topic:

Since its mass production in the 1950s, consumption of plastics grew at an astounding rate, surpassing all man-made materials. It is cheap, easy to make, and lightweight, yet durable enough to provide solutions in the food and beverage, car, electronics, healthcare, and many more industries. More recently, single-use plastics have become a defining feature of the fight against COVID-19, as the crisis spurred a steep rise in the demand and production of desperately needed safety plastic products, with governments racing to build their stockpiles of protective wear and citizens promptly acting to secure their share of supplies. Prior to the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, many countries made significant strides toward curbing the negative impacts of single-use plastics on our environment, exploring different approaches to do so. These range from improved waste management practices, financial incentives aimed at changing habits of consumers, retailers, and manufacturers, awareness raising, as well as policies and guidelines mandated for a more sustainable and circular production of plastics.

Single-use plastics are convenient for packaging but are usually discarded within few minutes of first use, i.e. grocery bags, plastic cutlery, food packaging, water cups, and bottles. As such, plastics have become one of the greater pollutants of our oceans and environment. Most plastics do not biodegrade, and instead take thousands of years to decompose into smaller fragments called micro-plastics. In the meantime, they are clogging landfills and floating around the world’s oceans harming marine wildlife. Once decomposed, the microplastics seep into the soil and are then consumed by livestock, entering the human food supply chain.

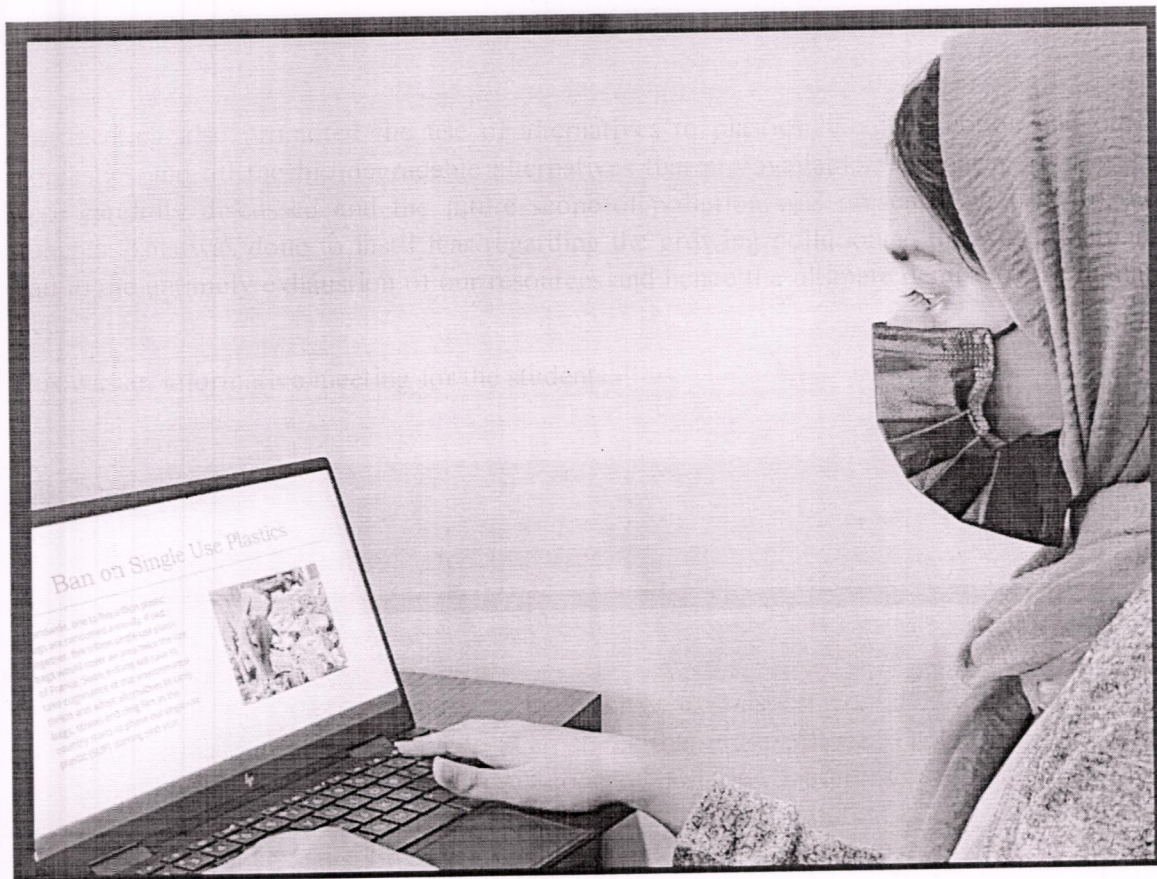
The ban will apply to plastics that are designed to be used once and then discarded — water bottles, cutlery, candy wrappers and bags — that clog local waterways and overwhelm landfills.

Few ideas were also discussed such as:

Finding sanitary ways for students to reuse food containers at campus restaurants and investing in cutlery made from corn or seaweed instead of plastic, which is made from the fossil fuels that are driving climate change.

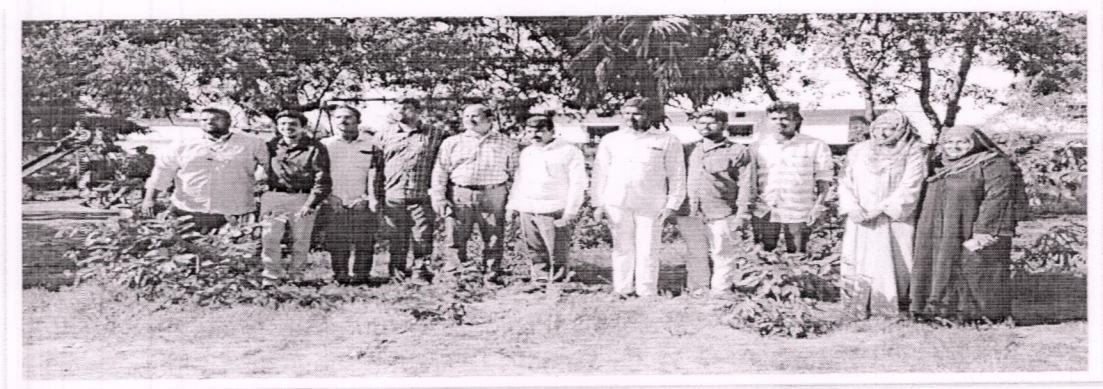
The meeting also promoted the use of alternatives to plastics like jute, cotton and other bioplastics and all the bio-degradable alternatives that are available. The harms of plastics were carefully discussed and the future scope of pollution was presented in front of the students. This was done to instil fear regarding the growing pollution in the world that can lead to the untimely exhaustion of our resources and hence the ultimate demise of the human race.

This was an informative meeting for the students.

### **Maintenance of Traditional Water Resources**

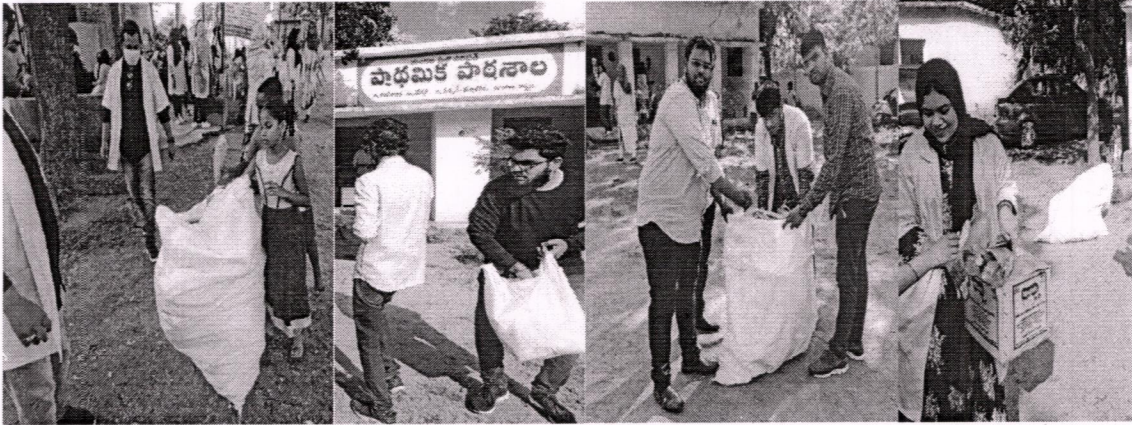

- Multivitamins and supplements

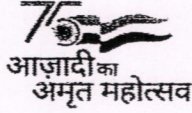
All in all, this was a very exciting and a useful programme to run and it motivates all of us to join the campaign and be a part of the big vision 'Clean India'.



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

# Guideline for the Swachh Bharat Summer Internship (SBSI)

From 10<sup>th</sup> June-31<sup>st</sup> July 2019

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Following the Prime Minister's clarion call on 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2014 for each individual to devote time to Swachhata through the year, and following the enthusiastic response from the youth of India to the Swachh Bharat Summer Internship 2019, the Ministry of Jal Shakti, in association with the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, and HQ NCC has launched the **Swachh Bharat Summer Internship 2019 – 50 Hours of Swachhata**. The initiative will give an opportunity to youth across the country from national level institutions like National Service Scheme (NSS), Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan (NYKS) or National Cadet Corps (NCC) to develop their skills and orientation for sanitation-related work and become a part of the Swachh Bharat Jan Andolan.

The programme aims to engage youth across the country, develop their skills and orientation for Solid Waste Management (SWM), and sustain the momentum of the Swachh Bharat Jan Andolan.

All interns are encouraged to share their internship journey on social media, using the hashtags - #SBSI and #SwachhSummer

## Components of the Swachh Bharat Summer Internship

The 50-hour internship programme would require the intern/interns to visit one or more villages and conduct Swachhata activities of their choice to contribute to the cause of rural sanitation in India.

1. **Duration:** At least 50 hours in the period of 10<sup>th</sup> June to 31<sup>st</sup> July 2019.
2. **Who can apply:**
  - Youth enrolled in either of the youth organisations – National Service Scheme, Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan or National Cadet Corps, can apply for the internship.
3. **Internship Process:**
  - Youth can enrol in this internship through the respective national-level youth organisation.
  - Interns may participate individually or in teams. Team size may be decided depending on the nature and scope of their activity, and approved by the parent organisation.
  - Interns will be required to devote at least 50 hours to conducting Swachhata-related activities, specifically on Solid Waste Management in villages selected by them and approved by the parent organisation.
  - The parent organisation may be approached with any requests for help with organisation of necessary logistics for the activities.

**Reporting:** An Internship Report must be submitted by the intern/interns to their local clubs/units within 15 days of completion of fieldwork.

### 5 Rewards and Recognition:

- a. All participants will be given a Swachh Bharat Internship Certificate on completion of their internship and its subsequent approval by the concerned NYKS/NSS/NCC units
- b. The best interns will be recognized at the District, State and National levels, as follows:

#### ✓ Cash Awards in addition to certificates \*

- Awards amount at District Level: Ist Rs 30,000, IInd - Rs 20,000, IIIrd - Rs 10,000
- Awards amount at State Level: Ist - Rs 50,000, IInd - Rs 30,000, IIIrd - Rs 20,000
- Awards amount at National Level: Ist - Rs 2 lakh, IInd - 1 lakh, IIIrd - Rs 50,000

## Energy Conservation Is The Need Of The Hour

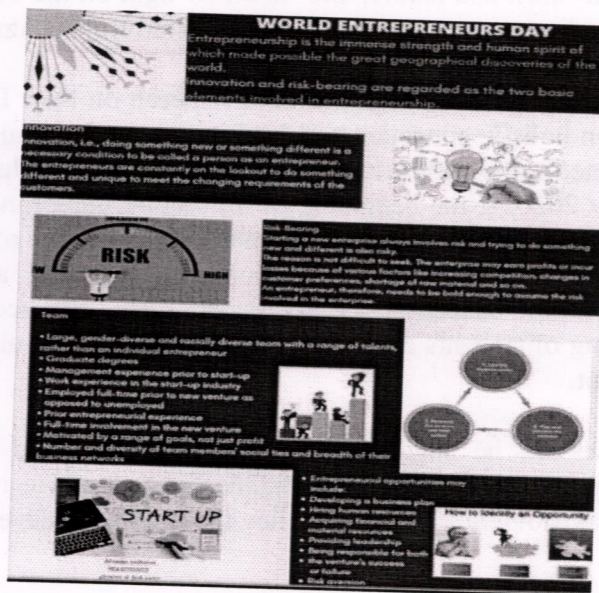

## Online Poster Making Competition on "World Entrepreneurs Day"

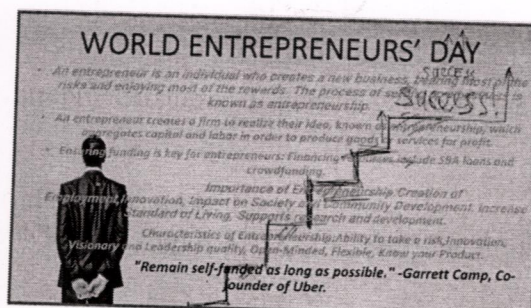
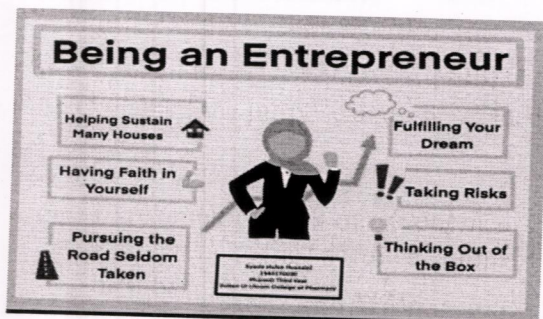

Entrepreneurship needs passion which is immense in youth, hence our college students provided important message to the youth to startup as an entrepreneur along with education.





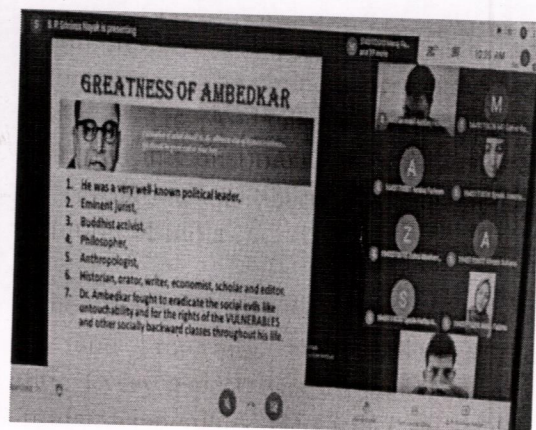
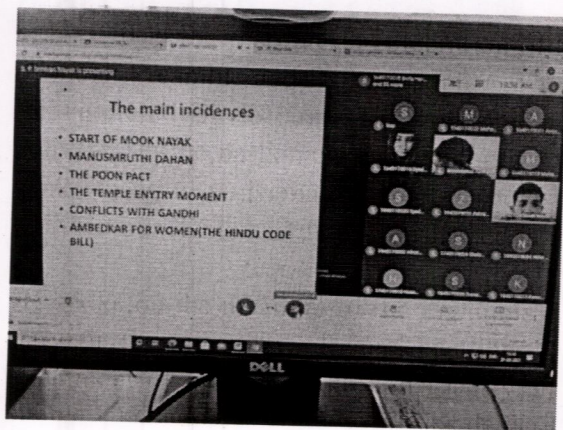
## A Talk on Dr. BR.AMBEDKAR ON CONSTITUTION DAY

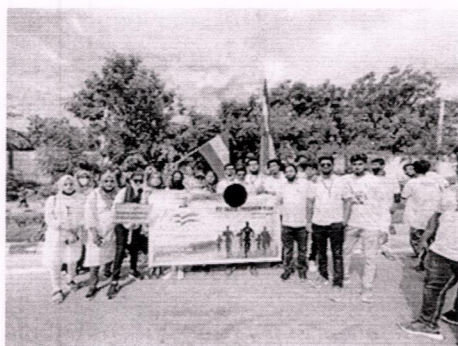


## REPUBLIC DAY CELEBRATION

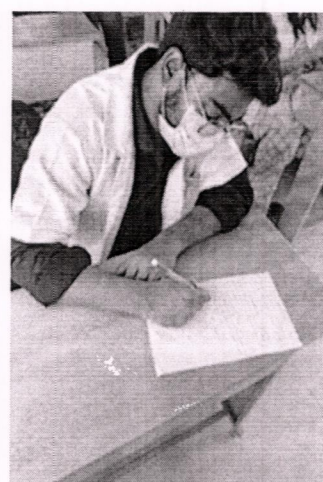
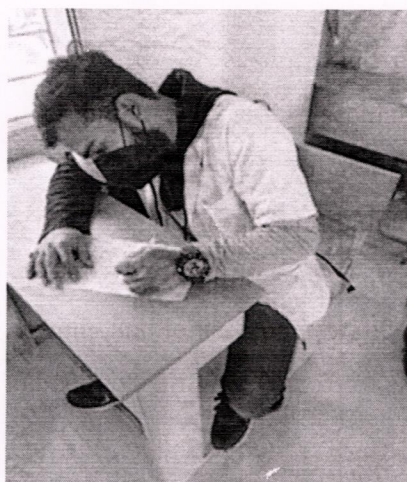
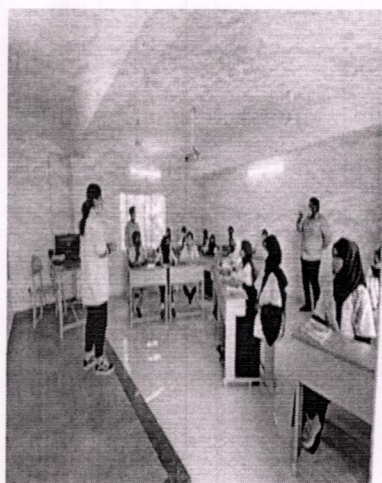
